



**SVA'S PRE-COLLEGE PROGRAM** is designed for high school students who want to enhance their creative skills, learn more about a particular field of art, develop a portfolio, and/or experience the challenges and triumphs that exist at one of the most dynamic colleges. Courses are taught by the same faculty of leading art professionals who teach in SVA's undergraduate degree programs. Students will explore the fundamentals of art and design at a level not readily available in high school. Students will receive one college credit for successful completion of the Saturday program and three credits for the successful completion of the summer program. The fall and spring programs are open to all students who will be enrolled in high school at the time of the program. Classes are held on Saturdays in three-hour sessions over 10 successive weeks. The summer program is an intensive three-week session in July, and is open to students entering their sophomore, junior or senior year of high school in the fall of 2014. Space is limited to approximately 20 students per course. Registration is online and is easy! Simply visit www.sva.edu/pc select Fall and Spring or Summer Program and select Course Offerings to view course descriptions and to register. Registration is based on a first-come first-served basis; no application materials are required to attend.

**SUMMER PROGRAM 2014:** Classes begin July 14 and run through August 1.

Approximately 400 students participate in the summer program. Students explore a range of general topics within a chosen field of study. Summer classes are taught Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. The summer program also offers a comprehensive program of supervised activities that takes full advantage of the social and cultural life of New York City: guided tours of museum and gallery visits, Broadway shows, cultural events. All students, family and friends are welcome to attend the final student exhibition and screening after the last day of class. Approximately 190 summer students will live in SVA housing. Housing students check in on Sunday, July 13. There is limited housing availability and registration is based on a first-come first-served basis. Summer program online registration will be available in January and is ongoing until individual classes fill up. 
## PORTFOLIO PRESENTATIONS FOR ENTRANCE TO AN ART COLLEGE:

The care with which an applicant presents and discusses his/her work can play an important part in the admissions and scholarship decisions at art colleges. As a part of the Pre-College summer program, all students are invited to attend Portfolio Workshop Presentations where admissions counselors will show examples of art work submitted by previous SVA students as well as examples of scholarship-level art work. Pre-College students gain a better understanding as to what they need to do to prepare for an admissions art portfolio if they decide to apply to an art college. Pre-College students are encouraged to visit with an Admissions Counselors and show their art portfolio. Admissions counselors will discuss ideas on how students may evolve their personal concepts and art process in order to help build a stronger and more expressive portfolio.
